

Sylvia Wang has performed as soloist and collaborative pianist across the U.S., Europe, Southeast Asia, Central America, Australia and Argentina. She has also recorded for the Newport Classic, CRI, Boston Records and Northeastern labels, as well as Block M Records in conjunction with iTunes.

Ms. Wang is currently on the faculty at Northwestern University in Evanston, Illinois, and has been presented by such organizations as the Music Teachers National Association in the U.S., Yamaha Music Malaysia, the Centre for Young Musicians in London, the Chautauqua Institution in New York and the Sydney Conservatorium of Music. She has been a winner and finalist for numerous awards and competitions, including the Royal Overseas Music Festival in London, the AVANTI award leading to a debut in London's Purcell Room, Chamber Music Yellow Springs in Ohio and the J.S. Bach International Piano Competition in Washington, D.C.

Her educational background spans 3 continents, starting in Penang, Malaysia, where she was born. At the age of 17, she embarked on formal studies at the Royal Academy of Music in London as a recipient of the prestigious Associated Board scholarship. At the Academy, she earned the highest award in solo performance, the Recital Diploma. Thereafter, she attended the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, New York, where she graduated with the M.M. and D.M.A. degrees with top honors.

In recognition of "distinction in the field," she was conferred an honorary Associateship of the Royal Academy of Music.
